ATTENTION DOG OWNERS Dog tag deadline MARCH 1ST - to avoid a penalty

You must register your dog(s) by March 1st to comply with the Township By-law. Dog Licences are available at the Municipal Office. The cost is \$7.50 for spayed or neutered dogs or \$15.00 otherwise. Please bring in confirmation of last rabies shot date. A licence must be purchased by March 1st 2018, after which there is a \$15.00 penalty – per dog. All permit applications will now be handled by the City of Sault Ste. Marie Building Dept. Civic Centre, Level 5 99 Foster Drive, Sault Ste Marie, ON P6A 5X6

Building Permits

Permits ensure that construction within the municipality meets with standards set out in the Ontario Building Code. No matter what the specific project may be, the enforcement of codes is carried out to protect public health, safety and welfare. Compliance with municipal by-laws such as the Zoning By-law is also evaluated during the review process.

Building permits are typically required for the following:

- New buildings
- Additions
- Renovations or alterations
- Demolitions
- Prefabricated structures
- HVAC systems (heating, ventilation, air conditioning)
- Miscellaneous for residential (pools, fireplaces, decks, fences, etc.)
- · Temporary buildings
- Installing new windows and exterior doors
- Installing new shingles or metal roofing
- Installing new cladding (siding, stucco, etc.)

To be sure, contact the Building Division at 705-759-5398 or email <u>building@cityssm.on.ca</u>, describe the work to be done and investigate what the requirements are.

If your questions cannot be answered over the phone or email, you can show your proposal to the Building Division staff at the Civic Centre - Level 5. They are always ready and willing to help!

MUNICIPAL ELECTION 2018 NOTICE OF NOMINATION

Any person planning to seek office in the 2018 Municipal Election for one of the Councils below must file a nomination form with the Clerk before any money is spent or raised for campaign activities.

Nominations may be made by completing and filing in the office of the Clerk, nominations on the prescribed form and accompanied by the prescribed nomination filing fee of \$200.00 for the Head of Council and \$100.00 for all other offices, payable by cash, certified cheque or money order.

Nomination forms are available at each Municipal Office during regular office hours. A nomination must be signed by the candidate and may be filed in person or by an agent during regular business hours between May 1, 2018 and July 26, 2018, and between 9 am and 2 pm on Friday, July 27, 2018 (Nomination Day). All completed and filed forms are public documents.

NEW: As of April 1, 2018, the nomination of a person for an office on Council must be

endorsed by at least 25 persons who are eligible to vote in a municipal election.

A person is qualified to be elected or hold office who, as of the day they file their nomination, is:

- 1. A Canadian citizen
- At least 18 years of age; and
- Resides in the local municipality, or is the owner or tenant of land in the local municipality, or the spouse of such a person;
- Not disqualified by any legislation from holding office.

In the event there are an insufficient number of certified candidates to fill all positions available, nominations will be reopened for the vacant positions only on Wednesday, August 1, 2018 between the hours of 9:00 am and 2:00 pm, and such additional nominations, if required, may be filed in the respective Clerk's office.

- Licensed dogs are likely to be returned home.
- Licensing your dog shows that you are a responsible pet owner.
- By-law 76/2003 requires that your dog be licensed by the Township.
